Here students met with local residents; Mr. Dilip who is member of panchayat committee explained how villagers are struggling with poor availability of fresh water. He said that they don't have natural resources of water, only can rely on water supply by government which provides the water daily for one hour. As it is the day which is celebrated for the importance of water and how villagers can use the 3'R principal – Reduce, Reuse & Re-cycle. The team sensetize to reduce quantity of water. To 'reuse' the water by utilizing kitchen waste water to irrigate the plants. To recycle the water they
