#### Message from the Vice Chancellor

Shree Guru Gobind Singh Tricentenary University, the center of excellence for the realization of dreams of inquisitive young minds eager to pursue higher education in innovative and job-oriented courses was established in January 2013 by Haryana private universities Act No. 8 of 2013.

The University has taken a stride forward in its development by establishing 18 faculties and offering more than 160+ courses in less than seven years. As a temple of learning, the university is committed to upholding the sacred objective of transforming the young participants as human assets through multi-dimensional pedagogy blended with innovative course curricula, the latest teaching methods, hands-on training, and intensive personality development and mentorship programs. In addition, the university has state-of-the-art infrastructure, hassle-free community life, and well-qualified, experienced, and dedicated faculty. To inculcate innovativeness amongst the faculty and students, the focus of the university is on conducting Research, Seminars, Conferences, Continuous Medical Education (CME) programs, and workshops. We are stepping forward in a direction endeavoring to become one of the best universities in the region.

The University organizes regular Techno Fests to promote the innovative work of our faculty and students. Inspired by the initiative of the Central and State Governments, the University organized a three days Techno Fest **"The Synergy- 2019"** in which students from all the faculties of SGT University, Technical Institutions, and Schools particularly those located in rural areas of NCR, participated and showcased their talents by displaying creative and innovative models developed by them. In these three technical festival days, nearly 22000 school students visited the event held on the university campus.

We have established the UNESCO bioethics Unit of the International Network of Bioethics to train potential teachers, students, and paramedical staff, and to develop an up-to-date syllabus for medical ethics education.

On the track record of placement, our students have been selected for Indian Administrative Services, Indian Police Services, Army Dental Core, UNICEF, UAE, Haryana Health Services, Health Reporters in NDTV and other News channels, Corporate Sectors, Universities, Colleges, Clinics, Hospitals, and others organizations of repute in India and abroad. To strengthen placements, the University has established a Corporate Resource Center manned by a strong team of Corporates.

Apart from experienced and dedicated faculty, and modern infrastructure of well-equipped Research Laboratories; SGT University has Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Incubations Center, well-stocked Libraries, auditoria, a wi-fi campus, residential facilities for students and employees providing ample facilities through recreational clubs, indoor/outdoor games and cultural activities.

In its social role, the University provides health services in its Hospitals at affordable charges. The Dental Faculty every year treats over 15500 patients through more than 200 free dental camps at rural outreach locations. The Nav-Muskaan Cleft Lip and Plate Center of the University provides a comprehensive cleft lip and palate treatment. In the last year, the center conducted more than 250 surgeries successfully, free of cost.

Inspired by Swa-Prarit Adarsh Gram Yojna (SPAGY) launched by the Government of India, the SGT University has established the Center for Rural Upliftment for providing free of cost doorstep Medical, Civil, Legal, Social, and other similar facilities to make the adopted village Budhera to develop it as an educated, healthy, socially harmonious village. The University is also providing doorstep free-of-cost medical facilities to 50 other nearby villages in Jhajjar District under the outreach program. The faculties of Medical and Dental Sciences of the University have also adopted Government Schools of Garhi Harsuru, Iqbalpur, Kaliawas, Sultanpur, Ullawas, Sudharna of Gurugram villages, and JJ School of Education, Farukh Nagar to provide free health care services on regular basis.

Based on the achievements enumerated above, in a short span, we are confident that the university shall make a mark for higher accomplishments with more dedicated efforts in the forthcoming academic sessions.

The university has developed a 62 acres lush Green Campus in NCR at Budhera in the vicinity of Gurugram, the emerging commercial and education hub of the country, with modern infrastructure and an excellent academic aura. # CHAPTER - 2

## 2 Faculties of the University

The university is imparting education for various courses through its following 17 Faculties:

# 2.1 Faculty of Agricultural Sciences

Realizing the need for well-trained agricultural graduates and postgraduates for public and private sectors and also for more and more demand for agricultural produce and processed products, it was envisaged to start the Faculty of Agriculture at SGT University, which was started in the academic session 2016-17. To meet the increasing demands from continuously decreasing arable land, innovative technologies and technical know-how in the fields of agriculture and allied areas remain the only solution to the most important issues. To achieve the desired results, the need of the hour is to train agricultural graduates and postgraduates with the latest knowledge along with innovative and modern research experience in agricultural and allied fields. The innovatively generated modern technologies applied to the farmers' field will help in achieving the desired goals. Initially graduation program i.e. B.Sc. (Hons.) Agriculture was started with an intake capacity of 90 seats. The course curricula were designed to produce competent graduates capable of competing at national and international levels.

The faculty also started Master of Science in Agriculture (M.Sc. Agriculture) in two disciplines, viz. Horticulture-Fruit Science and Agronomy from the academic session 2019-20. The syllabi and curricula are as per the ICAR requirement, as well as the market demands. The courses taught in the degree equip the graduates to find career opportunities in educational, research, and management fields in the public and private sectors. They can develop as entrepreneurs in agribusiness activities.

The Faculty of Agricultural Sciences (FASC) comprises meritorious and competent teachers from reputed institutes, adopting the latest teaching methodologies to groom students. Updated knowledge is imparted to the students. Students are involved in practical programs in the field right from the sowing of seeds to the harvest and in laborites for a different analytical part. The emphasis is on using hands-on training in teaching to transform the students into industry-oriented on completion of their degree. In the last year of the undergraduate degree, the students are offered a set of courses under the Module System, taking them to specialization in different fields of their interest.

Along with teaching, emphasis is also laid on research activities. During this period, many research projects have been handled by the faculty members. A crop cafeteria, including several vegetable and field crops, has also been established for making the beginner students acquainted with various crops.

# 2.2 Faculty of Allied Health Sciences

The allied health Sciences has become a very sought-after field of education looking at the importance it has gained over the years resulting in a huge gap of such professionals. To cater to this demand to whatever extent possible, Shree Guru Gobind Singh Tricentenary University entered the field of paramedical education with the introduction of degree and diploma courses in subjects such as Medical Laboratory Technology, Operation Theatre Technology, Radio-Imaging Technology, and Optometric Technologies in 2013.

The Faculty introduced specialized graduation courses in Neurophysiology Technology, Nutrition, Dietetics, and Sleep Science in 2014, M.Sc. in Radio Imaging Technology and Nutrition and Dietetics in 2015 to cope with the market need for specialized technical professionals. In progression to this B.Sc. in Microbiology and M.Sc. in Environmental Science were started in 2016 and M.Sc. in Medical Laboratory Technology, Operation Theatre Technology, and a Master of Optometry in 2017. A Paramedic is a professional who helps doctors in specialized areas and facilitates better diagnosis, treatment, and therapy. The increase in the number of patients, the variety of diseases, and the demand for immense treatment have paved the way for paramedical professionals who are expert technicians or therapists providing better quality human healthcare. Paramedics are key players in the Health & Medical Sector. Without paramedics, the entire health industry may become almost non-functional. The demand for laboratory technologists will always increase, as the number of multi-specialty hospitals, and laboratories are increasing. The career of a lab worker depends on academic and technical skills. A certified medical laboratory technologist may find an ever-growing career in a hospital, minor emergency centers, private laboratories, blood banks, doctor's clinic pathology lab, and various clinical research centers. Technologists can advance to supervisory or management positions in labs and hospitals. They can also work as Laboratory managers, Health care administrators, laboratory information system analysts, Educational coordinators, etc. Additional opportunities are available in molecular diagnostics and molecular biotechnology. All the courses offered by the Faculty are approved by Govt. of Haryana. The University has tie-ups with many super specialty hospitals to groom the students with all the latest technologies and to provide them with wider exposure to the health industry. We offer a regular mode of teaching supplemented by intensive and rigorous practical training that equips the students with knowledge of the latest techniques and trends so that on completion they can emerge as fully trained and thorough professionals. Aiming to provide higher education in the technical field and to enhance career opportunities, the Faculty of Allied Health Science is also offering Post-Doctorate courses in Radio-Imaging Technology, and Nutrition & Dietetics.

## 2.3 Faculty of Behavioural Sciences

The Faculty of Behavioral Sciences (FBS) was formally established as an independent entity in 2014 with the Department of Clinical Psychology. In 2017, the Department of Audiology & Speech Language Pathology (ASLP) was added. The RCI-approved M. Phil Clinical Psychology course was introduced in 2017. Several RCI-approved courses - Post-graduate Diploma in Clinical Psychology, Bachelor of Audiology, Speech Language & Pathology (BAS&LP), B.Ed (Hearing Impairment and Intellectual Disability) D.Ed (Hearing Impairment, Intellectual Disability, and Autism Spectrum Disorders) are being proposed from the academic session of 2019-20. Since the

inception of the faculty, Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology/Psychology was introduced in the specialized and applied areas of Psychology.

The faculty has the latest infrastructure equipped with state-of-the-art lecture rooms, a laboratory with psychological experiments and testing facilities, library facilities, and affiliation with OPD/IPD of the Psychiatry department. The vision of the faculty is to produce high-quality Psychologists for the Nation and global communities; to make significant contributions to the science and practice of psychology in real-life situations; and to produce professionals with sound ethical, legal, and moral values.

## 2.4 Faculty of Commerce & Management

The Bachelor of Education program comprises three broad interrelated curricular areas-

- 2. Curriculum and Pedagogic Studies help in the development of teaching skills that enable one to become an effective teacher.
- 3. Practical learning, a part of the course curriculum is a visible strength of the program. Such projects enable students in putting their theoretical Knowledge of the discipline into practice leading to the holistic development of would-be teachers.

After completing *B. Ed. Program* students can join the noble profession of teaching in Govt. / Private Schools. They can also find placement as Counselors (with MA in Psychology/diploma in Guidance and Counseling), as Education consultants, and as subject and pedagogy experts in both public and private sector companies.

The *Master of Education (M. Ed.)* program is designed to provide opportunities to students who want to be Teachers, Educators to extend as well as deepen their knowledge and understanding of Education, specializing in select areas, and also developing research competencies leading to specialization in either Elementary Education or Secondary Education. The students of the M. Ed. program can find placements as Teacher Educators in IASEs, DIETs, Directorates of Education, Councils of Secondary/Higher Secondary Education, SCERTs, Colleges of Education, and University Education Departments.

The faculty of Indian Medical System was established in the year 2015 with an intake capacity of 100 seats. Seats were filled through counseling by MD University. Currently, the college is having three batches of students (1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> Year).

It is also having a kshara sutra department, where various Ayurvedic surgical procedures are being done for Anorectal diseases.

#### **CHAPTER - 6**

#### 6 Admission Procedure

#### (As per 1<sup>st</sup> Ordinance of the University)

Admissions in the University are made strictly on the basis of merit. The merit for admission is determined either on the basis of marks or grades obtained in the entrance test conducted by University or the marks obtained in the qualifying examination. However, the admissions in professional and technical courses are made only through an entrance test.

Unfilled / dropout vacant seats in professional and technical courses are filled up by the University at their own level by considering the marks obtained by the applicants in the qualifying examination and on the basis of their inter-se-merit.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND NOTES TO ACCOUNTS FORMING PART OF ANNUAL ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED **31.03.2019**.

### I. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### 1. BRIEF:

The Trust Dashmesh Educational Charitable Trust is a registered public charitable Trust vide Registered Deed of Trust Dated 20.04.1999 The rules and regulation governing the Trust are primarily governed by such registered Trust Deed dated 20.04.1999.

Object of the Trust are wholly Charitable and Public Purposes. Any surplus arising out of the operation are meant to be utilized for such Charitable and Public Purposes only.

In pursuit of its objects, the Trust is managing a Dental College, Dental Hospital, General Hospital for charitable and public purposes and Shree Guru Gobind Singh Tricentenary University (SGT University) for educational activities purposes.

#### 2. RECOGNITION OF INCOME AND EXPENDITURE:

Accounts are prepared on historical cost basis on going concern assumption.

Revenues/Income and cost/Expenditures are generally accounted on accrual as they are earned or incurred in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles.

#### **Tuition Fee:**

Tuition fees and other fees received for pursuit of other curriculum activities such as library fees, hostel fee, transport fee etc., is recognized over the relevant period. Any fees received in advance for next accounting year is not recognized as income for the year and shown as a liability in the Annual Balance Sheet.

For sale of prospectus and Admission forms revenue is recognized at the time when the actual sale takes place on the concept of delivery of goods.

#### Books:

The addition of books and periodicals having value of enduring nature and forming part of Library collection is capitalized at cost. Rest all are charged to Income & Expenditure Accounts.

#### Foreign Exchange Transactions:

Foreign currency transactions are recognized at the prevalent exchange rate on the date of the transactions. Foreign Assets and Liabilities are stated at the rates on the Balance Sheet date., Any gain or loss in such exchange transaction is charged off to Income & Expenditure Account.

#### Voluntary Contributions:

Any voluntary contribution received by the Trust with the specific direction that they shall form part of the Corpus Fund of the Trust are recognized and credited to Corpus Fund. Other voluntary contributions received by the Trust are recognized as revenue receipt.

However, any voluntary contribution received in kind is not recognized in books of accounts, but is recorded in the fixed assets register, if any.

Any specific contributions received by the Trust for any specific purposes is recognized as Capital Receipt under the appropriate head, signifying the purpose for which such contributions are received.



## 3.PROPERTY, PLANT AND EQUIPMENTS:

Property, Plant and Equipment are stated at historical cost, less accumulated depreciation. The fixed assets are capitalized on the date, the asset is installed or commissioned for use,

All direct expenses for acquisition of specific fixed assets for the purpose of capitalization is considered as part of cost. Further, all indirect expenses, wherever possible, and are directly relatable to fixed assets are apportioned with reference to total direct capital cost of different assets.

#### DEPRECIATION:

The trust has reviewed the useful life of assets and found that assets life is over stretched and in a fastchanging technological world most of the equipment are rendered obsolete as soon as new technology is invented. Hence, effective 1<sup>st</sup> April 2018, in order to have a realistic & true representation of assets management has amended the useful life of asses as a result the charge of depreciation for the years is higher by Rs.17,35,53,045/- as compared to previous methodology and surplus reduced by the same amount. The following are the changes:

Depreciation on additions to assets or on sale/discardment of assets before 1<sup>st</sup> October is taken as complete year and additions to assets or on sale/discardment of assets after the date of 30<sup>th</sup> September is taken as half year as the case may be.

Software's, which are integral part of the computers are capitalized as part of the computers.

#### 4.INVESTMENTS:

Investments are valued at cost. Investments are made in the specified securities as provided in section 11(5) of the Income Tax Act. 1961.



#### 5.INVENTORY:

Inventories meant for re-sale are valued at the lower of cost or net realizable value. However, consumables bought for internal consumption are expensed out in the year of purchase.

#### 6. RETIREMENT BENEFITS:

Employer's Contributions to Provident Fund, Family Pension Fund are charged off to Income & Expenditure Account. In addition, provision also made in books for payment of gratuity worked out as per provisions of Payment of Gratuity Act.

#### 7.BORROWING COST:

Borrowing cost that are directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of qualifying assets is capitalized as part of the cost of such assets. A qualifying asset is an asset that necessarily requires a substantial period of time to get ready for intended use or sale. All other borrowing costs are recognized as expenses for the period in which they are incurred.

### 8.PROVISION FOR INCOME TAX:

Since the objects of the trusts are public charitable which is duly recognized by the Income Tax Authorities, the income of the Trust is exempt, subject to fulfillment of specific obligation under section 11-13 of the Income Tax Act 1961., therefore, no provision of tax is made in these accounts. However, in case of any tax demand arising to the trust or as raised by the tax authorities, shall be recognized, as and when the same is crystallized.
