In its social role, the University provides health services in its hospital at affordable charges. The Dental Faculty every year treats approximately 16500 patients through around 200 free dental camps at rural outreach locations. The centre also conducted more than 250 surgeries successfully absolutely free of cost.

Inspired by Swa-Prerit Adarsh Gram Yojna (SPAGY) launched by the Government of India, the SGT University established the Centre for Rural Upliftment for providing free of cost doorstep Medical, Civil, Legal, Social, and other similar facilities to the adopted village Budhera to make it an educated, healthy, socially harmonious and a developed village. The University is also providing doorstep free-of-cost medical facilities to 50 other nearby villages in Jhajjar District under the outreach programme. The faculties of Medical and Dental Sciences of the University have also adopted Government Schools of Garhi Harsuru, Iqbalpur, Kaliawas, Sultanpur, Ullawas, Sudharna of Gurugram villages, and JJ School of Education, Farukh Nagar to provide free health care services regularly.

Shree Guru Gobind Singh Tricentenary University was established on 24th January, 2013 by Haryana Private Universities Act No. 8 of 2013 to spread the messages of Shree Guru Gobind Singh Ji for the upliftment and betterment of mankind that can be best achieved through specialized and quality education. The university is founded on the pillars of developing leadership, encouraging innovation and disseminating strong ethics along with its dedication to achieve the objectives through academic excellence in all spheres of knowledge.

The university has developed a 62 acres lush Green Campus in Delhi-NCR at Budhera in the vicinity of Gurugram, the emerging commercial and educational hub of the country, with modern infrastructure and excellent academic aura. In keeping with its vision and mission, the campus has been designed with great sense of aesthetics to provide ecofriendly environment and ambience to stimulate the learning process.

Within a period of less than six years of its establishment, the university has taken long strides in appointments of highly-qualified, experienced and competent teaching and non-teaching staff, creation of modern classrooms, well-equipped labs, rich library, internet services, play grounds, clubs for extra and co-curricular activities, boys' and girls' hostels, residential accommodation, transport and other essential facilities.

CHAPTER - 2

2 Faculties of the University:

The university is imparting education for various courses through its following 18 Faculties:

2.1 Faculty of Agricultural Sciences

India requires globally competitive and better trained agricultural human resource capital in agriculture and allied fields to feed 18 percent of world's population with only 2.3 percent of the world's land and less than 4 percent of the global fresh water. In our country, there are many undergraduate degree programs that a student can pursue after their intermediate studies. But the students pursuing degree in Agriculture can find a lucrative career growth in various private as well as government-based industries. The agriculture sector in India is no longer confined to production but, it has now become a lucrative field with industrial needs and ample opportunities for candidates in the country and abroad. The demand for skilled professionals in the agriculture sector is high in recent times.

Respecting the aspirations of the people, the Faculty of Agricultural Sciences (FASC) at SGT University was established in the academic session 2016-17. The FASC is running both UG and PG programs to award degrees of B.Sc. (Hons.) Agriculture and M.Sc and Ph.D in all agriculture subjects. The FASC follows syllabi and curricula recommended by Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) from time to time. The Faculty is focused on experiential and self-guided learning, interdisciplinary course work and student-farmer-industry interaction to develop confidence, lifelong happiness and success among the

graduates. We have established links with many national and international Universities, ICAR Institutes and MNCs for internship, training, research and job placements.

FASC is proud to have a learned and dedicated team of more than 30 faculty members with rich SAUs and overseas experience in teaching, research and extension, who are recognized for their eminent teaching skills and outstanding research accomplishments. They provide an atmosphere not only for healthy academic activities but also for all-round growth and development of student's personality. Internationally acclaimed Guest and Adjunct faculty is also associated with teaching, research and counseling of our students. The Faculty of Agricultural Sciences is equipped with world class infra-structure including modern digital interactive class rooms, fully-equipped modern laboratories and controlled facilities, unique cafeteria of floriculture and vegetables, medicinal and aromatic plants and field crops, in house modules of skill and entrepreneurship development notably of vermi-composting, mushroom farming, bee keeping, organic farming, waste management and animal husbandry and a 20 hectares of practical, demonstration and research farm. A Static Soil Testing Laboratory at SGT University is approved and funded by Department of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Haryana under National Soil Health Mission to provide soil health information, fertilizer recommendation and training to the farmers. The facilities available at the FASC helps the students to develop much needed skills for local and global requirement of human resources and entrepreneurial mind-set to take up selfemployment, to sustainably enhance rural livelihood security, and to propel agricultural transformation through science informed options and actions.

Brief Write up of the Faculty:

Allied Health professionals are a distinct group of professionals who are important to the medical profession as they apply their expertise to cater to the tremendous expansion of health care industry. Tremendous expansion of the healthcare industry brings with it a growing demand for trained allied professionals. In order to cater to this demand to whatever extent possible, Shree Guru Gobind Singh Tricentenary University entered in the field of allied health education with the introduction of degree and diploma courses in subjects such as Medical Laboratory Technology, Operation Theater Technology, Radio-Imaging Technology and Optometry in 2013. The Faculty of Allied Health Sciences (FAHS) introduced specialized graduation courses in Neurophysiology Technology, Nutrition and Dietetics and Sleep Science & M.Sc. in Nutrition and Dietetics, Medical Laboratory Technology, Operation Theater Technology and Radio Imaging Technology, Masters in Optometry in 2014. Diploma programmes and B.Sc. in Sleep Science were scrapped in the year 2018. In progression to this B. Sc in Microbiology was started in 2016 and B.Sc. Cardiac Care Technology, Renal Dialysis Technology and M.Sc. in

Microbiology in 2019. Now, the Faculty has 10 Graduate, 6 post Graduate and 2 Ph. D Programmes running. Faculty started Ph. D. in Microbiology from the year 2020. The courses offered by the Faculty are approved by Govt. of Haryana.

FAHS offers regular mode of teaching through newer teaching methodologies duly supplemented by an intensive and rigorous practical training that equips the students with the knowledge of the latest techniques and trends along with training/internship within the campus and outside so that on completion they can emerge as fully trained and thorough professionals. They are also being provided virtual learning in our state-of-art one of the best Simulation labs in the country. Aiming to provide latest trends in medical technological field and to enhance the career opportunities, FAHS organizes workshops, guest lectures and industry visits for the students along with other academic activities regularly. We also inculcate research and innovation attitude in the students by organizing technofest/Synergy events.

The Faculty has tie-ups with multiple international and national organisations of great repute. The faculty has signed a MoU with Binawan Institute of *Health Science (BIHS) Jakarta, Indonesia* and with Fortis Healthcare Limited, New Delhi and has working collaborations for internships and trainings with reputed Hospitals Like. 2.3 Faculty of Behavioural Sciences

The Faculty of Behavioral Sciences (FBS) was formally established as an independent entity in 2014 with the Department of Clinical Psychology. In 2017, the Department of Audiology & Speech Language Pathology (ASLP) was added. The RCI approved M. Phil Clinical Psychology course was introduced in 2017. A number of RCI approved courses - Post-graduate Diploma in Clinical Psychology, Bachelor of Audiology, Speech Language & Pathology (BAS&LP), B. Ed (Hearing Impairment and Intellectual Disability) D. Ed (Hearing Impairment, Intellectual Disability and Autism Spectrum Disorders) are being offered from the academic session of 2019-20. Ever since the inception of the faculty, Ph. D in Clinical Psychology/Psychology was introduced in the specialized and applied areas of Psychology.

The faculty has latest infrastructure equipped with state-of-the-art lecture rooms, laboratory with psychological experiments and testing facility, library facilities and affiliation with OPD/IPD of Psychiatry department. The vision of the faculty is to produce high quality Psychologists for the Nation and global communities; to make significant contributions to the science and practice of psychology in real-life situations; and to produce professionals with sound ethical, legal and moral values.

Programs:

Ph. D in Pharmacy is purely a research program.

Pharm. D program is of full time six academic years duration, out of which five years of academic studies and one year of internship or residency with stipend at SGT Hospital. After completions of degree, they are ready to join Pharmaceutical Industry as Manufacturing Chemist or Quality Control & Quality Assurance associates. They can also take up higher studies like M Pharmacy, MBA and LLB.

The **B Pharm** (**Practice**) course offers an excellent opportunity for diploma holders who wish to upgrade themselves to graduate level and learn about the latest practices in pharmacy profession, with this additional degree qualification for better career and jobs in India and abroad.

D. Pharm (**Diploma in Pharmacy**) curriculum prepares pharmacists to handle prescriptions for compounding & dispensing. After completion of the course student are ready to get registered with any of the state pharmacy councils in India. After valid registration they are Registered Qualified Pharmacists under Pharmacy act 1948 and are eligible to be appointed as Registered Pharmacists in any of the Community, Hospital Pharmacies.

A diploma holder can also pursue B Pharmacy Lateral Entry or B Pharmacy (Practice) if in practice.

CHAPTER - 6

6 Admission Procedure

(As per 1st Ordinance of the University)

Admissions in the University are made strictly on the basis of merit. The merit for admission is determined either on the basis of marks or grades obtained in the entrance test conducted by the University or the marks obtained in the qualifying examination. However, the admissions in professional and technical courses are made only through an entrance test.

Unfilled / dropout vacant seats in professional and technical courses are filled up by the University at their own level by considering the marks obtained by the applicants in the qualifying examination and on the basis of their inter-se-merit.

NOTE "15"

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND NOTES TO ACCOUNTS FORMING PART OF ANNUAL ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31.03.2020.

I. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. BRIEF

The Trust Dashmesh Educational Charitable Trust is a registered public charitable Trust vide Registered Deed of Trust Dated 20.04.1999 The rules and regulation governing the Trust are primarily governed by such registered Trust Deed dated 20.04.1999.

Object of the Trust are wholly Charitable and Public Purposes. Any surplus arising out of the operation are meant to be utilized for such Charitable and Public Purposes only.

In pursuit of its objects, the Trust is managing Shree Guru Gobind Singh Tricentenary University (SGT University) including Medical & Dental College, Non- Medical Colleges, Dental Hospital, General Hospital for charitable and educational activities purpose.

The Trust is registered u/s 12A vide registration No. 599294 order dated 25/08/2000.

The Exemption u/s 80G (5) (vi) was last granted vide letter no. DEL-DE21150-18112009/2331 dated 18/11/2009 for the period from A.Y. 2010-11 to 2012-13.

2. RECOGNITION OF INCOME AND EXPENDITURE

Accounts are prepared on historical cost basis on going concern assumption.

Revenues/Income and cost/Expenditures are generally accounted on accrual as they are earned or incurred in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles.

Tuition Fee:

Tuition fees and other fees received for pursuit of other curriculum activities such as library fees, hostel fee, transport fee etc., is recognized over the relevant period. Any fees received in advance for next accounting year is not recognized as income for the year and shown as a liability in the Annual Balance Sheet.

For sale of prospectus and Admission forms revenue is recognized at the time when the actual sale takes place on the concept of delivery of goods.

Books:

The addition of books and periodicals having value of enduring nature and forming part of Library collection is capitalized at cost. Rest all are charged to Income & Expenditure Accounts.

Foreign Exchange Transactions:

Foreign currency transactions are recognized at the prevalent exchange rate on the date of the transactions. Foreign Assets and Liabilities are stated at the rates on the Balance Sheet date., Any gain or loss in such exchange transaction is charged off to Income & Expenditure Account.

Voluntary Contributions:

Any voluntary contribution received by the Trust with the specific direction that they shall form part of the Corpus Fund of the Trust are recognized and credited to Corpus Fund. Other voluntary contributions received by the Trust are recognized as revenue receipt.

However, any voluntary contribution received in kind is not recognized in books of accounts, but is recorded in the fixed assets register, if any AUB/A

Any specific contributions received by the Trust for any specific purposes is recognized as Capital Receipt under the appropriate head, signifying the purpose for which such contributions are received

3.PROPERTY, PLANT AND EQUIPMENTS:

Property, Plant and Equipment are stated at historical cost, less accumulated depreciation. The fixed assets are capitalized on the date, the asset is installed or commissioned for use,

All direct expenses for acquisition of specific fixed assets for the purpose of capitalization is considered as part of cost. Further, all indirect expenses, wherever possible, and are directly relatable to fixed assets are apportioned with reference to total direct capital cost of different assets.

DEPRECIATION:

The trust has reviewed the useful life of assets and found that assets life is over stretched and in a fast-changing technological world most of the equipment are rendered obsolete as soon as new technology is invented. Hence, effective 1st April 2018, in order to have a realistic & true representation of assets following changes have been made:

Depreciation on property, plant and equipment is provided at the relevant rates of depreciation on the basis of Straight-Line Method at the following rates:

Depreciation on additions to assets or on sale/discardment of assets before 1st October is taken as complete year and additions to assets or on sale/discardment of assets after the date of 30th September is taken as half year as the case may be.

Software's, which are integral part of the computers are capitalized as part of the computers.

4.INVESTMENTS:

Investments are valued at cost. Investments are made in the specified securities as provided in section 11(5) of the Income Tax Act. 1961.

5.INVENTORY:

Inventories meant for re-sale are valued at the lower of cost or net realizable value. However, consumables bought for internal consumption are expensed out in the year of purchase.

6. RETIREMENT BENEFITS:

Employer's Contributions to Provident Fund, Family Pension Fund are charged off to Incomo & • Expenditure Account. In addition, provision also made in books for payment of gratuity worked out as per provisions of Payment of Gratuity Act.

7.BORROWING COST:

Borrowing cost that are directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of qualifying assets is capitalized as part of the cost of such assets. A qualifying asset is an asset that necessarily requires a substantial period of time to get ready for intended use or sale. All other borrowing costs are recognized as expenses for the period in which they are incurred.

8.PROVISION FOR INCOME TAX:

Since the objects of the trusts are public charitable which is duly recognized by the Income Tax Authorities, the income of the Trust is exempt, subject to fulfillment of specific obligation under section 11-13 of the Income Tax Act 1961., therefore, no provision of tax is made in these accounts. However, in case of any tax demand arising to the trust or as raised by the tax authorities, shall be recognized, as and when the same is crystallized.
