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Message from the Vice Chancellor

The university has s state-of-art infrastructure, a hassle-free community, and highly qualified, seasoned, and committed faculty. In just eight years, the 18 faculties of the University are offering more than 170 programs. The institution focuses on research, holding seminars, conferences, continuous medical education (CME) programs, and workshops to foster innovation among the staff and students. The university has the UNESCO bioethics Unit of the International Network of Bioethics to train future instructors, students, and paramedical personnel in developing a current syllabus for medical ethics education.

The University provides intra-mural funds for such Technical Extravaganzas, where a significant number of students from all Faculties of the University showcase their talents through original and innovative models created by them. Such activities are inspired by the initiative of the Central and State Governments to "Make in India" and "Start-up India.", particularly under the aegis of Atal Community Innovation Center (ACIC).

Our students are placed in various organizations and professions. A few to highlight are the Indian Administrative Services, Indian Police Services, Army Dental Core, UNICEF, UAE, Haryana Health Services, Corporate Sectors, Universities, Colleges, Clinics, Hospitals, and many other highly regarded institutions in India and overseas. A Corporate Resource Center (CRC), staffed by an excellent team of Corporates, has been formed by the university to facilitate the placement of final-year students. The university has a contemporary infrastructure and campus environment, well-equipped research labs, an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), incubation centers, well-stocked libraries, an auditorium, a wi-fi campus, social clubs, and housing options for both students and staff. It also has ample facilities for indoor and outdoor games, sports, and cultural activities.

SGT University provides health services in its 810-bedded hospital at affordable charges. The Faculty of Dental Science treated 16200+ patients through more than 100 free dental screening and treatment camps at rural outreach

locations. Comprehensive cleft lip and palate care are offered by the university's Nav-Muskaan Cleft Lip and Palate Center. They successfully performed a substantial number of surgical procedures at no cost for the benefit of needy people. SGT University has constituted "Samajik Vikas, SGT ka Prayas (SVSP)" group formerly known as Community Action Group to serve and give back to the society the intellectual and practical knowledge gained through academic rigor. The outreach activity aims to address a wide range of community needs across various sectors, including community, schools, old age homes, orphanage homes, industries, farmers, youth, women & adolescent groups, ground level health workers, general population and all the needed areas where we can contribute in a significant manner to bring a desired change. It adopted Budhera village providing free access to civil, legal, social, and other ad-hoc medical, health, and development services to its inhabitants. As part of its outreach initiative, our university offers free medical services to 50 adjacent villages in the Jhajjar District. The faculties of Medical and Dental Sciences of the University adopted Government Schools of Garhi Harsaru, Iqbalpur, Kaliawas, Sultanpur, Ullawas, Sudharna of Gurugram villages, and in many private schools of Farrukh Nagar to provide free health care services to the residents regularly. Overall, outreach activities facilitated meaningful interaction and engagements with participants, empowering them with knowledge, skills, and resources to lead heathier and more informed lives. In the last one year there were a total of 321 such activities.

Based on the results and achievements demonstrated, we are optimistic that SGT University will leave an enduring impression of greater accomplishments with more committed efforts in the upcoming academic sessions.

Shree Guru Gobind Singh Tricentenary University was established on 24th January 2013 by the Haryana Private Universities Act No. 8 of 2013 to spread the messages of Shree Guru Gobind Singh Ji for the upliftment and betterment of mankind that can be best achieved through specialized and quality education. The university is founded on the pillars of developing leadership, encouraging innovation, and disseminating strong ethics along with its dedication to achieving the objectives through academic excellence in all spheres of knowledge.

The university has a 60+ acres lush Green Campus in Delhi-NCR at Budhera in the vicinity of Gurugram - the emerging commercial and educational hub of the country, with modern infrastructure and an excellent academic aura. The campus is beautifully planned to give an eco-friendly atmosphere and ambiance that will encourage learning in line with its vision and goal.

SGT university has made significant progress in the last eight years since it was founded in terms of hiring highly qualified, experienced, and competent teaching and non-teaching staff, building smart classrooms, well-equipped labs, a rich library, high-speed internet services, playgrounds, clubs for extracurricular and co-curricular activities, boys' and girls' hostels, residential housing, transportation, and other necessary facilities.

Having made significant contributions to the medical sciences, now the university is imparting knowledge and developing skills in 170+ courses through its 18 faculties covering Undergraduate (UG), Postgraduate (PG), and Doctoral programs (Ph.D.). The university organizes regular Continuing Education Programs (CME & CDE) Seminars, Conferences, Workshops, and specialized lectures by eminent academicians and corporates to expose the faculty and students to the most recent and cutting-edge developments in their respective fields. The University presented a commendable position in the publication of research papers. During the year 2021 and 2022, the teaching faculties of various disciplines published 538 and 982 research papers respectively Scopus, Web of Science and PubMed (peer-reviewed) journals along with the publication of 840 and 1112 books, chapters and conference proceedings in their respective subjects.

D level in the Faculties of Medicine & Health Sciences, Dental Sciences, Nursing, Allied Health Sciences, Physiotherapy, Commerce & Management, Law, Hotel & Tourism Management, Engineering & Technology, Mass Communication & Media Technology, Sciences, Behavioural Sciences, Indian Medical System, Agricultural Sciences, Fashion & Design, Education and SGT College of Pharmacy.

CHAPTER - 2

2 Faculties of the University:

The university is imparting education for various courses through 18 Faculties, briefly covered in the following subsections.

2.1 Faculty of Agricultural Sciences

India, accounting for 17% of world's population and over 30% of world's smallholder farmers, and 2.5% of the land and 4% of world's water resources, greatly impacts, and gets influenced by the state of global food scenario, agriculture, and natural resource system. Therefore, our country requires globally competitive and better trained agricultural human resource capital in agriculture and allied fields to world's largest population with scanty natural resources. We must produce more from less. Therefore, the demand for skilled well-trained professionals in the agriculture sector has been high in recent times. The students pursuing degree in Agriculture, therefore, have vast opportunities to find a lucrative career growth in various private as well as government-based industries. The agriculture sector in India is no longer confined to production but, it has now become a lucrative field with industrial needs and ample opportunities for candidates in the country and abroad.

To take advantage of above opportunities and to face the challenges, the agriculture research and education must shift from viewing agriculture as only a production and productivity issue that can be solved by a set of generic technology packages to one where agriculture is a key contributor to sustainable and resilient growth, development, and improvement of quality of life and the environment. Our graduates should be able to act in context of the stubbornly high incidence of food insecurity, stunted structural transformation, enhanced volatility both in agricultural production and market, accelerated environmental and ecological degradation, and widening inequalities.

Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) which plan, monitor and execute agricultural research, education and extension in the country; review, formulate and implement course curriculum from time to time as per requirement. ICAR accredit higher educational institutions (HEIs) for quality education. The Faculty of Agricultural Sciences (FASC) is accredited by ICAR for undergraduate degree {B.Sc. (Hons.) Agriculture} and M.Sc. Ag. (Agronomy).

FASC was established in the academic session 2016-17 and today running both UG and PG programs to award degrees of B.Sc. (Hons.) Agriculture and M.Sc. and Ph.D. in all agriculture subjects and MBA (Agribusiness). The faculty is focused on experiential and self-guided learning, interdisciplinary course work and student-farmer-industry interaction to develop confidence, lifelong happiness and success among the graduates. We have established links with many national and international Universities and MNCs for internship, training, research, and higher education and job placements.

FASC is proud to have a learned and dedicated team of more than 30 faculty members with rich SAUs and overseas experience in teaching and research, who are recognized for their eminent teaching skills and outstanding research accomplishments. They provide an atmosphere not only for healthy academic activities but also for all-round growth and development of a student's personality. The internationally acclaimed Guest and Adjunct faculty is also associated with teaching, research, and counseling of our students. The Faculty is equipped with globally competitive infrastructure including modern digital interactive class rooms, fully equipped modern laboratories and controlled facilities, unique cafeteria of floriculture and vegetables, medicinal and aromatic plants and field crops, in house modules of skill and entrepreneurship development notably of agriculture waste management, mushroom farming, bee keeping, organic farming, horticulture nursery management and animal husbandry and a 20 hectares of practical, demonstration and research farm.

To achieve its objectives of academic excellence and students' placement in jobs and higher studies, FASC has established Tie-Ups/MoUs with MNCs, ICAR institutes, and foreign universities. Collaborations with the industry and academic linkages are developed with public and private organizations industry for the attachment of students during

their final year so that they develop the necessary skills, and research capabilities to take up the employment and entrepreneurship challenges ahead. Our teachers are the recipient of extramural projects from different state and central government departments/funding agencies.

2.2 Faculty of Allied Health Sciences

The field of Allied Health Sciences encompasses a diverse range of healthcare professionals who use their knowledge to assist patients in need of medical care. Allied health professionals work to prevent, identify, and treat diseases and illnesses. They also use their management and administrative skills to help the healthcare system and patients. They employ scientific principles as well as evidence-based practices. The demand for skilled allied professionals is increasing as the healthcare sector expands rapidly. Shree Guru Gobind Singh Tricentenary University entered the field of allied health education in 2013 when it launched degree and diploma programs in medical laboratory technology, operation theater technology, radio-imaging technology, and optometry. The faculty now has 11 graduates, 8 postgraduates, and 7 Ph.D. programs in operation. The faculty's courses are approved by the Haryana government.

SGTU provides regular modes of teaching through newer teaching methodologies, which are supplemented by intensive and rigorous practical training that equips students with knowledge of the latest techniques and trends, as well as training/internships both on and off campus, so that they can graduate as fully trained and thorough professionals. They are also given virtual learning in our cutting-edge, best-in-country simulation lab. In addition to other academic activities, the Faculty of Allied Health Sciences organizes workshops, guest lectures, and industry visits for students in order to provide the latest trends in the medical technological field and enhance career opportunities. We also instill a research and innovation mindset in students by hosting technofest/Synergy style events. We have tie-ups with multiple international and national organizations of great repute. The Faculty has working collaborations for internships and training with reputed hospitals like RML Hospital, Delhi, Sir Ganga Ram Hospital, Delhi, BL Kapoor Hospital, Delhi, Sri Balaji Action Medical Institute (Delhi), Max Hospital, Gurgaon, Paras Hospital (Gurgaon), Columbia Asia Hospital (Gurgaon), Primus Hospital, Gurgaon, Sharp Eye Center, Delhi and Center for Sight, Delhi where students from our faculty are trained under the supervision of a specialized team for corporate placement in addition to their in-house training in our 878-bed hospital.

2.3 Faculty of Behavioural Sciences

The Department of Clinical Psychology was started within the SGT Hospital as a part of the School of Medical Sciences in 2013, with a Bachelor of Science and a Master of Science programs in Clinical Psychology within a traditional annual scheme in order to cater to the mental health needs and fulfil the huge gap in availability of trained Clinical Psychologists. The aim of these courses was to equip students with the knowledge of abnormality and deviance and the skills to be able to understand, assess and treat conditions of mental illness. The courses were geared to provide hands-on training to the budding Clinical Psychologists. The first Board of Studies held in 2013 also recommended to start PhD course and the first doctoral student in Behavioural Sciences was registered in January 2014.

The Faculty of Behavioral Sciences (FBSC) was formally established as an independent entity in 2014. FBSC is guided by the vision to develop professionals in the field of Clinical Psychology competent to meet the global standards as well as grounded in the local context to make significant contributions to the science and practice of psychology in real-life situations.

To keep pace with the latest research and developments in the field and to be in tune with the UGC Guidelines, the B.Sc. course curriculum was upgraded into the Semester mode in 2015. The first batch of students of this mode passed out in 2017. In addition to Clinical Psychology, thrust was also extended to Counseling and Guidance as a separate stream of study. At the masters' level, there is a provision for students to opt for the Counseling Stream from third semester since 2017-18, although Clinical Psychology is the stream of choice for students.

From the session 2017-18, B.A. (Hons.) Psychology was also introduced to incorporate non-Clinical courses such as counseling, organizational behavior, social psychology, rehabilitation psychology, psychology of elderly, and neuro-psychology.

During the session 2017-18, existing programs – B.Sc. and M.Sc. Clinical Psychology were revised and a number of new courses were added to keep pace with the demands and needs of the industries and the students. From time to time professionals from various organizations including NGOs visit the Faculty, particularly those where our students are assigned for training, and who provide us genuine feedback. In turn, we continue to make desired changes in curriculum, transaction methods and delivery etc., keeping in mind UGC Guidelines and University Ordinances. We have incorporated field training, summer training and case study reports as part of the course curriculum.

The M.Phil. Clinical Psychology program (2-year duration) started in 2017 and Professional Diploma in Clinical Psychology (1-year duration) started in 2019 are distinctive additions in the Department of Clinical Psychology signifying constant development and diversification. These programs are running as per RCI guidelines.

The introduction of new programmes and modifications in the curriculum design of existing programmes are proposed and approved by the Board of Studies (BOS) that is reconstituted every three years according to the University Ordinances. The decisions taken in the BOS are then ratified in the Academic Council (AC).

Since the University has a major focus on health and health related disciplines, the FBSC plays an important role in all the community programs run by the University with a special responsibility for the mental health component. It provides a good exposure to the students to the real-life settings and more so, sensitivity towards the needs of the rural population, which are usually left outside the mainstream of educational and health service delivery systems.

The faculty embraces participatory, experiential, discursive and student-centric practices in its teaching-learning endeavors. The following are hallmarks of our teaching approach:

- Regular Field Visits/Field Training/Practicum
- Robust Organizational Interface with Mental Health Organizations and Experts
- Role Plays, SIS, Group Discussion, Problem Based Learning and Invited Lectures

- Summative Assessment based on multimodal pedagogy.
- Organization of lectures, conference/ seminar/workshops, symposia, etc.

Our mission to prepare professionals in psychology, particularly in clinical psychology has proved highly useful in the service of community and encouraged with this, FBSC continues to develop and expand the field of psychology in newer and exciting ways. To uphold our strong academic tradition, FBSC aspires to foster high standards of excellence amongst the students and train them to acquire right knowledge, attitudes and skills to understand the intricacies of mind and behavior. Our psychology graduates are in high demand by a wide variety of employers because they possess unique skills and competencies.

We are constantly working towards our mission of delivering quality education and standard professional training, both on- and off-the campus. Capping of Due to large number of students enrolling for few Value-Added Enrolment to Value-Courses (VAC) and Multidisciplinary Generic Elective Courses **Added Courses** (MGEC) and having difficult in accommodating in available infrastructure, it has been decided to fix capping in Value-Added (VAC) and Multidisciplinary Courses (VAC) and Multidisciplinary Generic Elective Courses (MGEC) and a timeline to register for the above program:

Generic Elective Courses (MGEC)

- To ensure effective delivery, a minimum enrolment of 15 students is required to offer any VAC & MGEC. This minimum number is crucial to ensure a sufficient level of student engagement, active participation, and fruitful discussions within the course. It would help maintain the intended learning outcomes and foster a collaborative learning environment.
- If the number of students enrolled in a particular course is less than 15, those students will be advised to consider selecting an alternative course to ensure a robust educational experience for all participants. This step aims to prevent any compromise in the learning experience for a small number of students and provide them with viable options that align with their academic goals. An additional section can be made at the discretion of the faculty in case of the availability of faculty members of the concerned subject. Special approval may be sought from Vice-Chancellor, SGT University.
- To maintain an optimal learning environment and ensure individual attention, the maximum capacity for each VAC & MGEC course would be 60 students. Limiting the number of participants would enable us to maintain a manageable student-to-faculty ratio and ensure personalized attention and quality interactions. This approach would promote effective student engagement, facilitate comprehensive assessments, and cater to the diverse learning needs of our students.
- If there is withdrawal/change of course, after the commencement of the course meeting the criteria (i) & (ii), a minimum threshold of 05 (five) students would be kept to continue offering the selected VAC or MGEC. This threshold would help maintain the viability of the course and ensure that a sufficient number of students can continue their studies without compromising their learning experience. In case, the number of students falls below the minimum threshold of 05 (five), they will be advised to select an alternate course.

Timeline to Register for all University Umbrella Courses

 The students are required to register for the University Umbrella Courses within two weeks of registration for the program. By establishing this timeline, we aim to provide students with ample time to familiarize themselves with the offered courses and allow faculty to efficient course scheduling. • Students will be allowed to change their University Umbrella Course selection only once, within two weeks of their program registration, with prior approval from the Dean. This flexibility will accommodate situations where students may require adjustments to their selected courses due to unforeseen circumstances or changes in academic preferences.

2.21 Research & Development Cell

The Research & Development Council (R&D) of the University aims to create and support research culture among its faculty and students and leverage it to enrich and enhance the professional competence of the faculty members. The compilation of the University's research data in the form of Research Grants, Journals and Conference Publications, Patents, etc., created a vibrant research profile of the University. The Council encourages undergraduates to do research projects that inculcate project writing skills at an early professional age. The R&D office is working enthusiastically for the smooth conduction of research activities throughout the 18 faculties of the University.

In 2022-23, the University received 9 Extramural Research Grants and 2 Conference Grants from various funding agencies (ICMR, SERB, DSIR, ICSSR, MoEs, INCOIS, IGNCA, etc.) with a cumulative amount of ₹238.54 lakhs. 2.25 National Reference Simulation Center

The National Reference Simulation Centre is established in the year 2018 in the tetra partite collaboration with Indian Nursing Council (INC), John Hopkins Program for International Education in Gynecology and Obstetrics (JHPIEGO) funded by USAID, Laerdal Medical India, a Norway based company and Shree Guru Gobind Singh Tricentenary University (SGT), Gurugram in 14000 sq.ft. area.

It is Asia's First referral center which is designed to cover the medical and nursing education with the interprofessional education to deliver in-service training programs the simulation-based learning. It has high fidelity, medium fidelity and low fidelity manikins which has significance of degree of realism which helps in artificial representation of a real-world process, and when students get exposed will help them to become competent and confident to encounter the actual patients in any emergency situation.

Simulation is in its preadolescent stage where it has lot of space for the development in India and across the globe. It is the newer methodology coming across where the students will have the opportunity to enhance the competencies by doing and learning through the debriefing sessions. In addition to this, it focuses on the principle of adult learning where they are exposed to the experiential and reflective learning in a psychological safe container to make the students more confident by allowing them to commit errors to learn from the mistakes on the simulated patients. If we talk about the benefits it helps in bridging the gap between the knowledge and practice which allows the students to learn the interprofessional team dynamics, leadership, communication, problem solving and critical reasoning skills especially of the cases and diseases which students rarely come across in the clinical setting in the unpredictable situations.

OBJECTIVES

Demonstrate delivery of high-quality training in skills and simulation

Giving a hands-on training to the students and to make them competent is the need of the hour especially in the medical field. When we talk about simulation training it itself a unique opportunity to provide your students hands-on experience and knowledge of skills. The students become more competent and confident by practicing the skills multiple times on the task trainers and managing the emergencies and unpredictable situations on the simulators

and the high fidelity manikins without fear of losing and harming the patient in actual practice helps them to gain a deeper knowledge to boost up their confidence to work in the clinical area.

National Reference Simulation Centre is designed in a way where the medical students are exposed to the different realistic critical situation with the high fidelity manikins to perform in the simulation sessions in three different phases as pre briefing, scenario and debriefing where the learning takes place as a whole in a team.

Train 800 Nursing faculty from all states of India as master trainers

Simulation based Education is the methodology which has now been inculcated in the Nursing curriculum, keeping that in mind it has been decided to make this centre as the state of the art facility in which the 800 nursing faculties will be trained at NRSC as the master trainers on Simulation methodology from the different states of India. Out of 800 total 454 faculties have been trained till the 19th batch in the month of December 2022.

Generate evidences for integration of simulation in B.Sc. Nursing curriculum

Though this objective was being made in the year 2018, based on the research studies in the NSCBN 2015 stated that high quality simulation can substitute up to 50% of clinical hours in the pre licensure education. The Simulation Based education as a methodology has been updated in the new syllabus of B.Sc. Nursing curriculum by the Indian Nursing Council. There is one more research is going on which has to be analyzed yet by replacing the 25% of Clinical hours with the simulation, which is in collaboration of SGT University, Indian Nursing Council and Jhpiego, New Delhi, India.

Create hub and spoke model by linking NRSC with nursing institutions.

NRSC is the Asia's first Reference centre of simulation which is in tetrapartite collaboration with Indian Nursing Council, John Hopkins Program for International Education in Gynecology and Obstetrics, Laerdal Medical India and Shree Guru Gobind Singh Tricentenary (SGT) University, Gurugram, Haryana with great model infrastructure. It is important that this lab should be utilized in its best way which is possible to create the center as a training hub by connecting with the other nursing institutes and organizations where the students and health personnel should be benefitted with the best facilities.

Demonstrate a model for inter-professional education.

NRSC works as per the Circle of Learning which covers five components includes, knowledge, skills proficiency, Decision making, Simulation in teams and Clinical experience/ practice. When we talk

Basic Life Support Training

BLS training is made mandatory for both undergraduate and postgraduate students of all disciplines. Under this course, the participants learn the basic skills of managing a cardiac arrest victim whether an adult, Child or infant. Hands on training is provided on delivering high quality CPR and use of an AED. They are also trained on managing Foreign Body Airway obstruction in all age groups.

Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support Training

In this program, the participants are taken through a whole lot of clinical case scenarios of cardiac arrest. They are trained regarding the importance of recognizing precardiac arrest situation and immediate action that needs to be taken. The training involves airway management skills, use of manual defibrillator, medications, treating the potential reversible causes of cardiac arrest and Post resuscitation care. Team dynamics is an important component of this training.

Trauma Life Support Training

This training program is organized for interns and postgraduates of Anesthesiology, Surgery, Orthopedics, Emergency Medicine. Training involves management of trauma victim, primary survey, secondary survey and hands on practice on Airway management skills, including Crico thyroidotomy, Central line insertion, Intraosseous cannulation, Needle decompression, Chest tube insertion and interpretation of X- rays and CT scans.

Arterial Blood gas Analysis

Training involves management of patients with acid base disorders. Participants are trained on identification and interpretation of Respiratory acidosis and alkalosis, metabolic acidosis and alkalosis, mixed acid base disorders and management based on clinical case scenarios discussed in these sessions. Hands on practice on radial artery and femoral artery blood sampling is also given.

Basic and Advanced Neonatal Resuscitation Training

Training involves resuscitation care for a full term and pretertn newborn. Participants are trained on initial assessment and care for a new born baby soon after the delivery, bag mask ventilation, suctioning, chest compressions, medications and advanced airway management skills with hands on practice.

TOT on Simulation Based Education

This is a training of trainers on the Simulation Based Education for the nursing faculty in India in collaboration with Indian Nursing Council where the senior faculties have been trained for six days on the simulation methodology including how to use case studies, checklists and different teaching skills to deal with the students as adult learners.

Capacity building for the Midwifery faculty

This is a training programme for the five days on skill standardization and simulation methodology for the Midwifery faculty of India & International nurse midwives in collaboration with Indian Nursing Council under the UNFPA project. The faculties have been trained on the midwifery skills along with the facilitation skills to deal with the adult learners followed by simulation methodology.

Skills Training

Skills trainings are conducted for the medical undergraduates as a part of their postings in different clinical department to learn commonly performed skills and procedures under that department. The skills training involves, IV/1M injections, IV Cannulation, Urinary Bladder Catheterization, wound care and dressing, Normal Birth simulation, Fundus skill & Pelvic assessment, Pre & postnatal care, Airway Management, Needle decompression, application of splints, Nasogastric tube insertion and gastric lavage, Auscultation of Heart and Lung sounds, ECG & defibrillation, Lumbar Puncture, CVP, Family planning (IUCD & PPIUCD)

Visits/ Meetings Coordinated by the Department

- 1. Online Meeting with Jerry Luftman: Discussion on various certificate Courses offered by Global Institute of IT Management on 30th March 2023.
- 2. Visit of representatives of Edinburgh Napier University and Glasgow Caledonian University from Scotland. All sides agreed on the potential for collaboration through student and faculty exchange programs, as well as joint research initiatives, and wanted to take the discussions on a potential agreement forward.
- 3. MD and CEO, Mr. Ambarish Datta and Sr. Vice President, Mr. Pulock Bhattacharji of BSE Institute visited the campus in March 2023. I was discussed to start industry aligned BCom and BBA courses at the Faculty of Commerce and Management, SGT University. Students can specialize in any domain like Financial Markets, Financial Technology, Data Science, Cyber Security, Securities Law, Financial Journalism, or Leadership Development.
- 4. Delegation from 5 members states of the European Union: As part of its "**European Research and Higher Education Day**," SGT University invited speakers from the European Union (EU) and its member states to address its postgraduate students.
 - Students had the opportunity to understand the ecosystem for international research and outward mobility, thanks to the presence of a constellation of significant figures from education and research. India's youth presents a unique opportunity for Europe in terms of 'Brain Saturation' and those who can recognize and take advantage of this, stand to benefit greatly.
- 5. A delegation of Faculty Members from Vilnius Tech University visited our campus in March 2023. Established in 1956, Vilnius Tech is one of Lithuania's largest research universities, focusing on technologies and engineering and placing a strong emphasis on university-business collaboration. Our students from the Faculty of Engineering and Technology had a chance to meet and interact with the officials and learn about the unique opportunities offered. The visiting Professors have also offered to come and stay on campus for a semester as well as work on joint projects.
- 6. Mr. Wang Jin, a representative of the Songgok University in Seoul, South Korea visited the campus in February 2023 to discuss possible joint research, student and faculty exchange programs. He was left fascinated by the beautiful "Basant Utsav" being celebrated on the University grounds. He also saw our NRSC program, as we explored about the possibility of student exchange and training of Korean Nurses at SGT University.
- 7. MOU Signing with Zoomabroad, UK for discussions on a 2+1 Program.

Inbound Exchange Program

Department of Oral Medicine and Radiology hosted 6 students from Manipal University College, Malaysia for Elective Observership Program from 19-03-2023 to 27-03-2023. They were given an enriched exposure to variety of clinical cases such as orofacial infections, Oral Leukoplakia, Oral Submucous Fibrosis, Trigeminal Neuralgia, Cervical Lymphadenopathy and to procedures like PRP Therapy, Intralesional Steroid Injections and FNAC. Students were given exposure to the surgical management of orofacial cleft and maxillofacial trauma, surgical management of radicular cyst, osteoradionecrosis, zygomatic fracture through live surgical transmission. Students also visited all the departments of faculty of dental sciences and the departments of Dermatology, ENT and General Radiology for exposure to mucocutaneous lesions, ENT cases and head and neck cancers interpretation by CT. The interdepartmental interactions were thoroughly enjoyed by the students and included a lot of interactions with the faculty and Postgraduate students. In order to give exposure about the comprehensive management of Oral Cancer, A field visit to American Oncology Institute was organized wherein students were given exposure about the radiotherapeutic management of Oral Cancers. Also, a visit to

National Reference Simulation Centre was organized for the students. A workshop on Lasers in Oral medicine and guest lecture on "Management of Oral Lesions- An Ayurvedic Perspective" was organized for the students. The Office of External Affairs helped in the coordination of the whole event.

Outbound Exchange Program

8 students and 1 faculty member from Faculty of Dental Sciences visited AIMST University, Malaysia in September 2022 for a 2 weeklong Global Immersion Program. Students experienced extensively in preclinical workshops, discussions, demonstrations as well as observe polyclinics working in the AIMST University. They had different sessions every day in the college from 9am-5pm. On the first day, Deputy Deans – Dr Siva Kumar Pendyala and Dr Manikandan Natarajan being coordinators of GIP in AIMST University discussed the overall 2 weeks program and showed the Faculty of Dentistry to SGT group. The Office of External Affairs arranged this exchange program from planning to execution.

2.29 Centre of Excellence for Andragogical and Pedagogical Sciences(CEAPS)

Andragogical Sciences encompass the science of teaching and learning processes of adult learners. Higher Education Institution like ours deals with adult learners who bring in their own life experiences, orientation and self-motivation towards learning and thus contrasts with the child (pediatric) learners who are easily directed and molded by the teacher. Consequently, the teaching methodologies for adult learners require a different approach and facilitation. Also, the paradigm shift in education brought about by the pandemic and the National Education Policy 2020, necessitates the continuous skill development of the teachers to be at par with the growing demands of the changing education system.

Therefore, our SGT University has established **Centre of Excellence for Andragogical and Pedagogical Sciences** (**CEAPS**) which is an exclusive centre to train the teachers as per the changing paradigms of teaching and learning processes. This shall improve the overall outcome of teaching-learning processes.

This is first of a kind centre in the entire nation that aims to popularize the concept of Andragogy for the teaching in Higher Education Institutions considering the differences in the psychology of learning for adult and child learners.

CHAPTER - 6

6. Admission Procedure

(As per 1st Ordinance of the University)

Admissions to the University are made strictly based on merit. The merit for admission is determined either based on marks or grades obtained in the entrance test conducted by the University or the marks obtained in the qualifying examination. However, admissions to professional and technical courses are made only through an entrance test.

Unfilled / dropout vacant seats in professional and technical courses are filled up by the University at their level by considering the marks obtained by the applicants in the qualifying examination and based on their inter-se-merit.

9.5 Faculty of Behavioural Sciences

Faculty members have been contributing in the area of research and publication. During the last academic session, more than 18 research articles are published in journals – including UGC listed, Scopus indexed and peer reviewed

reputed journals. 57 doctoral research scholars are pursuing their research in thrust areas of Clinical Psychology/Psychology, out of which 05 Ph.D. was awarded in year 2022-23, and one is submitted.

Prof. Waheeda Khan, pursuing a research project titled 'Neuro-cognitive correlates of prospective memory and emotion recognition in children with and without Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)' by the Department of Science and Technology (DST), Government of India.
